There are certain occasions or activities that happen in school for which we are required by law to seek consent. To ensure that we hold the correct information for you or your child, please read and tick as appropriate, whether you agree to each of the statements.

Article 8 of the GDPR (as implemented in the UK) states that when you rely upon consent as your lawful basis for processing personal data;

- only children aged 13 years and over may lawfully provide their own consent for the processing of their personal data;
- an adult with parental responsibility must provide consent for processing if the child is under 13.

For the purpose of consent, we have made the decision to apply this from the academic year following a child's 13th birthday therefore students in Year 9 and above must consent for themselves. However, regardless of age, we recommend you speak to your child before choosing whether to give consent in the different areas, so they know themselves what they can and can't be involved in and the reasons why.

Please note that we do not attach full names to photos of students, unless specific additional permission is provided beyond the consent obtained as part of this data collection.

We operate a cashless payment system to purchase food in school and for printing or photocopying on the school's Managed Print System. This uses biometric data in the form of fingerprint recognition. The technology scans the finger and generates a unique identifier to access the student's account. The fingerprint image is not stored and cannot be used by any other system. Students have the right to choose not to use the biometric system and if consent is not given for us to collect this data they will be issued with a PIN which would need to be entered at the till when purchasing refreshments or at a printer to release printing.

The school will **only** act in line with the conditions that you provide consent for.

Consent remains valid for the academic year 2018-2019 except the fingerprint which is for their school lifetime unless consent is withdrawn.

Withdrawing your consent

You have the right to withdraw your consent at any time. Withdrawal of consent only applies from the date it is withdrawn, however, the school will make every effort to remove images of the pupil where possible, e.g. images of the pupil on the school's website will be removed.
