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Marsha P. Johnson and The Stonewall Uprising of 1969

Marsha P. Johnson was a gay liberation and AIDS activist and self-identified drag queen. She is well known as an outspoken advocate for gay rights and as one of the prominent figures in the Stonewall uprising of 1969.

June 28th, 1969 marks the beginning of the Stonewall Uprising, a series of events between police and LGBTQ+ protesters that stretched over six days. Patrons of the Stonewall, other village lesbian and gay bars, neighborhood street people fought back when police became violent.

The riots are widely considered the watershed event that transformed the gay liberation movement and the twentieth-century fight for LGBT rights in the United States. A few weeks after the event, new LGBTQ+ organisations and newspapers were founded. A year later, the first Pride parade took place on its anniversary, and the next day, Pride events and marches took place on the West Coast.

From then on, the marches spread across the USA and around the world and are still widely celebrated to this day.

What is Pride Month?

Pride month is the celebration of LGBT+ identity and recognition, and in many countries is celebrated in the month of June, commemorating the Stonewall riots that took place in New York City in late June and early July.

And with Xfinity, it's Pride all year.'.

Of course, it is possible to help stop these companies and by doing research on companies you hope to use and to stop supporting them and buying products or services from them.

The right to an abortion should never be 'circumstantial'

So now that I have provoked emotion in you as a reader I should probably elaborate...

Or rather I shouldn't because there really isn't much more to say than that.

My beliefs have always been (and will always be) that anyone who is capable of becoming pregnant should have the right to have an abortion if they choose to do so. There are hundreds of things that could cause one to seek abortion: financial situation, age, relationship status, family, abuse or maybe they simply do not want to be pregnant or have children. No one should ever have to justify their abortion because you wouldn't look someone who'd had one in the eyes and ask them why they aborted the embryo. You wouldn't tell a new mother that she should've aborted her baby and you wouldn't stand outside of an abortion clinic and harass people going in for procedures. Well... at least most of you wouldn't.

It is socially acceptable for people to have children without any of this interrogative questioning, so why isn't it socially acceptable for people to not have children? Yes, yes I know "we've come a long way" and "it's not the 50s anymore", but it really is not as acceptable for people, especially women, to state that they do not wish to have children as you may think it is.

Following the issues raised in the USA at the moment, their logic is completely flawed. It is mere common sense that women should have full autonomy over their bodies and they should be the only ones to have a say in the issues of abortion and contraception rights. 303,000 women a year die from pregnancy related complications and labour. This is roughly 830 deaths a day, 1 death every two minutes.

All these exceptional circumstances for abortion laws are an insult to all women. "Oh you can only get an abortion IF...", it is disgusting that anyone should have to give a reason that they would like an abortion. We don't ask for justification as to why people have children so why do we need justification in the opposite circumstances? Women are told constantly that their reproductive rights are circumstantial.

You can only go on the pill if...

You can only have the implant if...

You can only have an abortion if...

IF IF ... Maybe if these "law-makers" truly started acknowledging and listening to the voices of so many women, who are so desperate to maintain their basic human rights, we'd have a society where far fewer women die through botched abortions and self induced abortions and even attempts on their own lives because they cant see any other way to get around these outrageous laws.

Not only are there heavy restraints wrapped around any sort of reproductive rights women have as a whole, laws like this send the message that women should be ashamed of their sexuality. A big defence that 'pro-lifers' use is 'well if you dont want to get pregnant dont have sex'. But why? Why shouldn't we? Men are not penalised the same way we are when an accidental pregnancy occurs. A man can impregnate 9 women everyday for 9 months (that's 2,430 pregnancies) whereas a woman can only get pregnant once in those same 9 months. So please explain to me why all the responsibility is burdened onto the woman? The woman is told that she should have been careful and she should've been cautious, as if it's something to be ashamed of.

Law upon law upon law is being passed with each coming year and where on earth are we going to end up if we let things carry on like this? We are beginning to live in a world where a woman has little to no say over her body, that genuinely terrifies me.



The lesson we need to learn is; have children, don't have children, have an abortion, don't have an abortion. It is your body and yours only. Do not try to dictate to other women what they should do with their bodies.
