



Here are a few ways to help you learn and remember your spellings. Try a few each week and see which work best for you.

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| <p><b>Keep Copying</b><br/>Write your words out three times each. | <p><b>Take a test</b><br/>Ask someone at home to test you by reading each word you write them down.
