Arrangements for the end of the year

Arrangements for September 2025


- Monday 1st and Tuesday 2nd September are training days and pupils return to school on Wednesday 3rd

- We had our transition day at the end of June where pupils have already had an opportunity to be in their new tutor groups and work on our values of Be Kind / Work Hard / Aim High. We also look forward to welcoming record numbers from other feeder primary schools in the locality as they join our new Year 7.

School uniform

We are putting more of a focus on a higher expectation for school uniform next academic year. All of our local state secondary schools insist on high standards of uniform compliance and we are no different in that respect.

One of our biggest issues this year has been the frequent removal of the clip-on ties by pupils during the school day. From September, I would like all pupils to wear a proper school tie and we will support them in learning how to tie it. In my experience, this takes a few days to bed in and then the pupils know what to do. Ties can be purchased on the My Child at School App anytime and you can collect these in the last two weeks of the holidays from reception, we will share reminders on social media and via the app.
