Dear Parent and/or Carer,

Your child has expressed an interest in completing their Silver DofE Award. They do not have to have completed their Bronze Award to sign up for the Silver Award.

### **What is The Duke of Edinburgh Silver Award?**

It is recognition of a young person's successful journey of self-discovery and development, acclaimed by employers and universities alike all over the world for demonstrating the qualities it develops in the young people who achieve it. It is a balanced programme that develops the whole person - mind, body and soul, in an environment of social interaction and team working. The Silver Award takes approximately 12 months to complete.

Completion of the Silver Award will involve your son/daughter successfully completing 4 different sections enabling them to show commitment and further develop their skills. The four sections include a physical activity, a skill, volunteering and completing a 3 day expedition (including two nights of camping). It may be that they are already taking part in an activity that falls into one of the sections, in which case they will now be able to gain recognition for this. Equally, we will be encouraging pupils to undertake new experiences.

All after-school training sessions for the award will commence when your child has enrolled, running from 3:30pm – 4:30pm on a Tuesday. Your child will receive a full training calendar once they have enrolled. Bus passes are available for students who normally travel via school bus.

### **How much does it cost?**

It costs £165 to complete the DofE Silver Award in total. This is required in 3 instalments spread across the year (see overleaf), paid via School Comms. We have decided this year to split the costs across the year to make the payments more accessible. We pride ourselves on being one of the cheapest centres offering DofE in the region; however, we do require the payments to cover outgoing costs for your child to complete the award. The £165 cost covers:

- Online access to eDofE, insurance and certification costs
- All internal training run by JCSC qualified staff
- First aid training, delivered by a qualified first aider
- Practice Expedition & qualifying expedition, including campsite fees, transport to and from JCSC & assessor fees.

**There is funding available for students that receive Free School Meals to cover the cost of the award. Please see overleaf for more information.**

Your child will need to provide walking boots/shoes for the expeditions. A kit list is attached, showing what we are able to provide to your son/daughter free of charge and what they will be required to supply themselves. They do not require any of the kit until the Easter term.

In order to enrol your child onto The Duke of Edinburgh Award scheme, please could you complete and return the enrolment form/reply slip (attached) and make the first £60 instalment via School Comms by Friday 24<sup>th</sup> October 2025. In the meantime, if you have any questions please do not hesitate to contact me. All payments are not refundable as this will impact on others attending the course.

### Payments:

The following instalments are required by the following dates:

- Instalment 1: Friday 24<sup>th</sup> October 2025 (£60) – pay via School Comms
- Instalment 2: Friday 23<sup>rd</sup> January 2026 £50 – pay via school comms
- Instalment 3: Friday 20<sup>th</sup> March 2026 (£55) – pay via School Comms

Please note that the second instalment is refundable upon: completion of the qualifying expedition **and** all borrowed kit is returned without damage. We will send out a pre-addressed envelope for instalment 2 after instalment 1 has been paid.

### ***What if my child receives Free School Meals?***

If your child is eligible for Free School Meals, then we can apply for funding to cover the cost of the award. Please tick the appropriate box on the reply slip if you would like to be considered for this funding. Each funding application is considered on an individual basis and we will contact you individually to inform you whether the application was successful. If funding is successfully granted, you will still be required to pay instalment 2 in order to borrow kit.

### ***What if my child decides to drop out of the award?***

If your child decides to withdraw from the award at any time throughout the year, you will **not** be required to pay the remaining instalments. However, we are not able to refund any payments made after the instalment deadlines.

### Expeditions:

Your child will be required to attend both the Practice Expedition and the Qualifying Expedition in order to complete this section of the award.

**Silver Practice Expedition:** Friday May 8<sup>th</sup> – Sunday 10<sup>th</sup> May 2026 (The Cheviot Hills, Northumberland)

**Silver Qualifying Expedition:** Monday 13<sup>th</sup> July – Wednesday 15<sup>th</sup> July 2026 (Durham Dales, Barnard Castle)

**Please note these dates may be subject to change due to curriculum time at school. Please do not book holiday during these times.**

### Kit

In order to keep the cost of the award as cheap as possible, we are able to provide students with the majority of kit needed to complete the expedition section of the award. The table below outlines the kit that is needed, what the students are required to supply themselves and what we can offer. In order to maintain the kit, we do require a £25 deposit for the kit, which is refundable on the basis that all the kit is returned and not damaged (this does not include general wear and tear).
