	<p>Pupils consolidate and develop their theoretical knowledge and practical skills building on their studies in Year 10.</p>	<p>Pupils are given their externally moderated synoptic assignment brief worth 60% of their final grade.</p> <p>They will be required to research and compare key features and equipment linked to hair, makeup and nails from a specific era to the services and treatment used in the modern hair and beauty industry. This will then turn into a written piece of work - including images.</p> <p>Pupils will then be assessed on creating the hair and beauty looks to showcase their technical hair styling, makeup and nail skills.</p> <p>Finally, pupils will plan, produce and evaluate promotional content for the brief.</p>	<p>Pupils will prepare for their externally set and marked paper-based exam worth 40%. This assesses pupils' depth and breadth of understanding across the mandatory content in the qualification.</p>
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Examples of on-going assessment and feedback in lessons

- Verbal feedback by the teacher to the whole class which pupils act on in the lesson
- Pupils self-assess or peer-assess work with a clear framework guiding them through this
- Teachers circulate to give 'LIVE' and immediate feedback as pupils are working independently
- Pupils may complete mini quizzes or retrieval activities that revisit prior learning and receive verbal feedback
- Use of tailored questioning by the teacher
