THE SCHOOL DAY

Pupils should arrive no later than 8:40am.

The school day starts at 8:45am and ends at 3:15pm.



UNIFORM

EQUIPMENT

All pupils will need a school bag suitable for carrying equipment to and from school. Each child will be provided with their own School Planner at the start of each school year which must be brought to school each day. Pupils are also expected to bring the following: a black or blue pen, green pen, pencil, pencil sharpener, eraser, ruler and glue stick. It would also be useful to bring a set of colouring pencils. All of these items can be purchased from our school stationery shop at reception.



NEW SCHOOL BUILD

The build of our new school is underway with completion expected by the end of 2026. This investment in the Amble community will ensure that generations of our young people will have access to high quality facilities and increased educational opportunities in years to come.

BREAKFAST CLUB

Our Breakfast Club is sponsored by Greggs and is open to all pupils each school day. Toast, cereal and juice are provided free of charge and other items are available to purchase. The club starts at 8:00am and runs until the start of school. Booking is not required.



COMMUNICATION

READING

All pupils have access to the school library which is well stocked with a variety of books that pupils can borrow and take home. Year 7, 8 and 9 benefit from regular Library lessons with their English teachers and our in-school librarian to encourage reading for pleasure. Pupils will also be supplied with reading recommendations' throughout their time at our school.



TRANSPORT

We are fortunate to be close by to many of our pupils, who choose to walk, cycle or scooter to school. We encourage pupils to practise good road safety and to follow the Green Cross Code. If pupils need to arrive by car, we ask that cars do not enter the school car park. Pupils who need to use school transport should apply for a bus pass by visiting the NCC website [here](#).

Paying for school meals and extras

We serve snacks, meals and drinks from our school canteen every break and lunch time. Pupils use our cashless catering system, whereby money can be added to a students catering account digitally via the My Child at School app. Alternatively, pupils/ parents can also credit their account with cash at reception.

Free School Meals

If your child receives free school meals (FSM), a credit to the amount of a school meal (£2.40) will be added to their account each day. Any additional items over this amount will be charged to the pupils account however, there must be sufficient funds on the account to make the purchase.

If you are unsure whether you are eligible for FSM, we would encourage you to check by visiting the Northumberland County Council website. Registering a students' entitlement to FSM can help the school unlock extra-funding whether they decide to eat an FSM or bring their own packed lunch.

PASTORAL SUPPORT

Our team of Pastoral Support Officers (PSOs) work with pupils and families to support good attendance and behaviour for learning. They are also on hand to provide a listening ear to students and signpost/ refer for further help for wellbeing and mental health help when needed. There are dedicated PSOs for each school year to promote and build positive relationships with both students and families.





MOBILE PHONES

Pupils must not use mobile phones in school. If pupils misuse a mobile phone in school, the phone will be confiscated and will need to be collected from the office at the end of the school day.



HOME LEARNING

Pupils use Google Classroom to access resources and work set by their teachers. We recommend students download the Google Classroom App to receive notifications from their teachers when new work is posted or the class teacher wishes to send a message to the students. The Google Classroom app is available to download for free on Apple, Android or Chrome devices.



EXTRACURRICULAR CLUBS

We encourage our pupils to become involved in as many extra-curricular activities as possible, both in school and in the wider community. Clubs in school run during lunch times and after school. For your child to take part in these activities you may be required to grant permission and register attendance within the My Child at School app.



INCLUSION

We pride ourselves on inclusivity and our SEND team run a programme of targeted interventions to aid with literacy, numeracy and social skills. We ensure pupils with SEND will access the same curriculum as their peers and that individual learning needs are met.
